Goal: GGCA conducted its first annual survey of Golden Gate residents to help us better understand your interests and how we can best serve you.


Outreach: The online survey was sent out via the GGCA listserv on January 6, 2026 and posted to our Instagram and Facebook pages, and on NextDoor.

Results: We received 86 responses between January 6 and February 3 that are summarized below.


2. What's your relationship to the Golden Gate neighborhood?


3. How did you hear about GGCA?

4. What type of neighborhood events would you like to attend in 2026? (check all that apply)




5. Which social media platforms are you most active on?


6. Would you consider playing a more active role within GGCA? (check all that apply)

Common themes from open-ended (free text) responses: providing a platform (listserv) for getting connected, discussions, recommendations, and sharing information, cleanups and other efforts to improve the neighborhood, family-friendly events/block parties, shouting out local businesses, keeping residents informed about changes in commercial corridors, addressing public nuisance and public safety issues

9. What can GGCA do better?

There were 28 open-ended (free text) responses with at least one suggestion for improvement. All the suggestions were related to just a few common themes.
